
At a time of profound social, political, and environmental challenges and crises, calls for various types of transformations have become increasingly urgent. This conference—"Transformations in Critical Times. Perspectives from the Environmental Humanities"—focuses on the socio-environmental dimensions of the crises and explores the theoretical implications and practical meanings that scientists, politicians, activists, and other publics associate with transformation.

The conference situates recent developments within their respective historical contexts, tracing how current transformations unfold on global, regional, and local levels, how they are connected to past experiences, and how they intersect with culturally specific visions of possible futures.

"Transformations in Critical Times" features five thematically distinct workshops that explore the challenges of implementing the socio-ecological transition in meaningful and new ways. The conference brings together case studies about land transformations and government policies, explores the transformative potential of cultural artefacts, examines the power of intervening voices, discusses the practical implications of living in a digital age, and highlights the role of agency and community as prerequisites for building a sustainable future.

Two prominent keynote speakers will set the tone of the conference and enrich the multi-disciplinary conversation:
